Past honours include singing in the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games; the Paralympic Games, and as a featured soloist in the Pan-Pacific Games. Shannon was also a guest entertainer at the 2001 Commonwealth Day celebration at Parliament House, Sydney. Selected in 2000 to become a student in the Talent Development Project, Shannon also performed as a featured artist in the 17th Schools Spectacular.

He was recently featured in a television commercial for the Department of Education and Training, singing 'Each Your Children Will a Crosby, Still, Nash and Young song. Even more recently, Shannon delighted Wollongong audiences with his sensitive and incredibly mature portrayal of Henry Higgins in 'My Fair Lady', a Wollongong HSPA production at the Entertainment Centre.


Lincoln Hall (Keiraville PS)

10 year old Lincoln is another young man 'going places'. For two years he has been a soloist in Schools Spectacular, Darling Harbour Christmas pageant and "An Illawarra Christmas". Lincoln has also sung the National Anthem at an NRL Hawks game.
